SCHOLARSHIP. The Award winning Scholarship Program of the Geneva-Excelsior Lions Club -
has just been completed for the 1974-75 school year. Once again, each and every member -
of the Club can be extremely proud of this youth project, which is now in its tenth year.
This year, we have, as we have for the past several years, held two separate and
distinct contests. One comprising the students from Balboa High School, and the other -
comprising students from Riordan and St. John Ursuline High School. Nine students compe-
ted for scholarship, and three were selected to receive awards in varying amounts, ran-
ging from \$500.00 to \$100.00.

The Scholarship Committee, consisting of Lions Robert Dobbins, Chairman, Dr Raymong -
Squeri, Ronal Faina, William Tonelli and Albert Gentile, spent a great amount of time e-
valuating each contestant's grades, in-school activities, awards received and school of
pipes held, community activities and finally an assey. The final phase consisted of a
round table discussion, with the students and all of the committee members, lasting over
three hours. After due deliberation, winners were selected as follows:

These awards were presented to the recipients at appropriate ceremonies at the various
schools.

Additionally, each of the participating students received a Savings Bond from the
Club acknowledging their participation.

On June 25th, 1975, the Geneva-Excelsior Lions Club hosted the first place winning -
students and their parents at our regular meeting, at which time plaques were presented.
They were an impressive group of young people, and it was evident to all present why
they have been selected for these scholarships. From the comments received from the stu-
dents and their parents it is obvious that they were impressed with the fact that Lio-
nism is structured toward assisting our youth of today, and that the Geneva-Excelsior -
Lions Club, through this scholarship program is a leader in this field! It is the ex-
press intent of this program that these outstanding students be chosen on the basis of
being well-rounded students, thus involving a balance of grades, activities, writing abi-
lity and ability to express themselves in a round-table discussion. This is one of the
few scholarship programs that is not qualified by financial need or ethnic origin. When
the student receives this award, he or she has earned it on their own.

This program has, since its inception, been financed by special projects designed to
raise money for it. The principle ones are our Calendar Project and Candy Sales. This
should be remebered by all club members when the time for these projects rolls around -
once again.
