It houses up to five children between the ages of five days to seventeen years for periods of from one or two days to as long as five months. Children are temporarily placed there by authorities for their protection. The children come from distressed backgrounds. They are not adoptable, but most of these battered, abused and deserted children need foster homes. The shelter can always use donated children's clothing and toys or games.
