This walking tour from Kearny St. to Union Square takes about an hour. Prior to 1920 Maiden Lane was first know as Morton's Alley, then

Morton's Street, then Manila St. Jeweler Albert Samuels proposed to the city that it become known as Maiden Lane as jewelery centers of other famous cities are named. When the 1849 Gold Rush brought about 5,000 men to the city where only 800 people had resided is the time Morton's Alley turned infamous. Enterprising prostitutes were able to earn enough money in a couple of months to return home to retirement.
