THE MEETING

Lyle Workman did his usual good job with the signage, and Handford Clews coordinated ticket sales and seating arrangement again. Thanks also to Gino Benetti, John Madden and others who donated raffle prizes.

Co-Ch'mn. Dick Johnson invited a critique on the feed. A letter from a patron was received complaining not enough swing music was played. Bar coordinator Joe Farrah asked more different members to volunteer to tend bar for future Crab Bashes.

Youth & Community Activities Ch'mn. Bernie Hammarstedt reported that he still has more raffle tickets available, and that Bill Tonelli just took yet another two books of tickets. Bernie requests that all money and tickets be turned in to him by March 19th.

Used eyeglasses Coordinator Charles Bottarini announced that all eyeglasses should be turned in to him prior to April 19th.

\$302 was the prize in the Convention Raffle. President George Salet drew Dick Johnson's winning ticket number. Dick's prize was a plain white golf ball. Of the \$4 Ward Donnelly won in the Attendance Raffle, he donated \$1 to the Convention Fund. Nobody identified himself as being the Mystery Lion.

The Board of Directors meeting was

called to order. The Treasurer's report was waived (see above). Attendance Ch'mn. Sam San Filippo reported attendance for the month of February was 60%.

Board Action included an allocation to contribute \$100 towards sending needy local grammar school students to attend symphony performances, and an allocation of \$300 towards \$1,224 needed to send high school student Joseph Workman to "Operation Closeup" in Washington D.C.
