On your Planting Day, your group is joined by their corps of trained volunteers for a morning of rewarding work planting trees--and a neighborhood pot luck lunch. Then, as your trees grow, their experts remain on call to advise you on proper tree care. They even have a low-cost tree care program to ensure your trees become established, develop well and have healthy futures.

Trees fight pollution by filtering particulates from the air and releasing oxygen.

Trees increase privacy and help absorb traffic noise.

Trees create relaxing, beautiful and healthy spaces.

Trees provide habitat for the city's birds, squirrels and other wildlife.
