Ranger Kevin gave the club an overview of the service, a branch of the Dept. of the Interior, which has been in existence for 85 years. Prior to the creation of the Park Service, the overseeing of national parks was done by the U.S. Army. Then he gave the club an update on the satus of The Presidio, Crissy Field, Ft. Point, Alcatraz Island, Sutro Baths, Fort Mason and other Bay Area

locations supervised by the Park Service. For example, Ft. Point is closed four days a week to allow for heavy retro-fitting work being done on the Golden Gate Bridge. The beach in the area of Fort Funston is rapidly receding due to erosion. The Sutro Baths complex is about to undergo a badly needed renovation. The Fort Mason Center is involved in one of the most exciting park renovations anywhere. Huge military structures, once a major port of embarkation, now house a full spectrum of cultural, educational, and recreational programs. Food is available in the Zen Center Greens Restaurant. Crissy Field is a great place for walking at the water's edge. The Golden Gate Promenade, paved throughout its length, traverses the area.
