They are located at 4877 Mission St. Arrangements have been made for members of this club to tour the facility at 5:30 P.M. prior to the June 2nd meeting.

May 19th Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Lyle Workman. Pledge to the flag was led by Bob Fenech, and Joe Farrah gave the invocation. A total of 10 members and 5 ladies were in attendance. George Salet conducted introductions.

Program

Sister Mary Virginia Leach, a Dominican nun from Immaculate Conception School, a girls high school at 24th & Guerrero spoke about the school's history and goals. The school was founded in 1883. Annual tuition is \$10,000, and financial support is needed. She focused on the Cristo Rey Network. A Cristo Rey Network high school provides high quality college preparatory education to students from low-income households. The bedrock of a Cristo Bey model high school is the Corporate internship or "work-study" program, which places students into entry level clerical positions and generates much needed revenue for the school.

The Corporate Work Study Program began in 1996 with the founding of the Cristo Rey Jesuit High School in Chicago. The Cristo Rey model expanded to a nationwide network with funding from the B.J. Cassin Educational Initiative and Bill & Melinda Gates Foundations.

The program works by companies contracting with Immaculate Conception Academy's work-study program for full-time administrative positions. A team of four students shares one job. Students rotate their schedules, each working five full

days every four weeks. Academic schedules are structured so that students never miss class.

The sponsors pay a set fee of \$29,000 per year or \$2,900 per month directly to the ICA Corporate Work Study Program for each full-time position. This money earned goes to offset a significant portion of the student's cost of education, enabling the school to lower its tuition charge to families.

This pre-convention meeting is the occasion for raffling off all of the remaining Convention Raffle money. The winners of the majority of the money were Lyle Workman \$230; Diane Johnson \$115 and Margot Clews \$25. Absent Galdo Pavini missed out on \$2 in the Attendance Drawing. Mystery Lion George Salet had no victims.
