Guest Speakers

Our guest speakers from the Coalition of Concerned Medical Professionals presented shortly after the meeting began. Presenting was Michaele Ramirez, with CCMP since 1986, and has held many different positions. She is currently in charge of food pickup and distribution, and Barry Pearl, with them for several years and is a retired San Francisco City Planner with 30 years service to San Francisco. They talked to us about:

- They last visited us in 2009 after which we donated \$300 to them.
- Medical care and our national position on the world stage.
- Access to medical care by low income workers and unemployed people.
- Why people come to them for help.
- That the organization was founded in 1976 and is made up of a broad spectrum of volunteers.
- Their advocates help find the best outcome for their clients' conditions.
- Started the pandemic with phone contact and have progressed to some in person contact.
- Cited several examples of those they have helped.
- Have increased weekly food support to 3 tons of food in San Francisco and 6 tons in the East Bay.
- After care support.
- Their support for the United Nations' 2030 Agenda.
- They are looking for support and volunteers including financial support, a newer van, and office supplies. They need \$5000 in support each month.
- Looking for support from individuals or from Lions Clubs like ours.
