



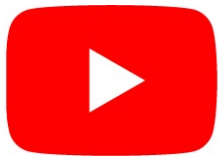

Discussed at the meeting:

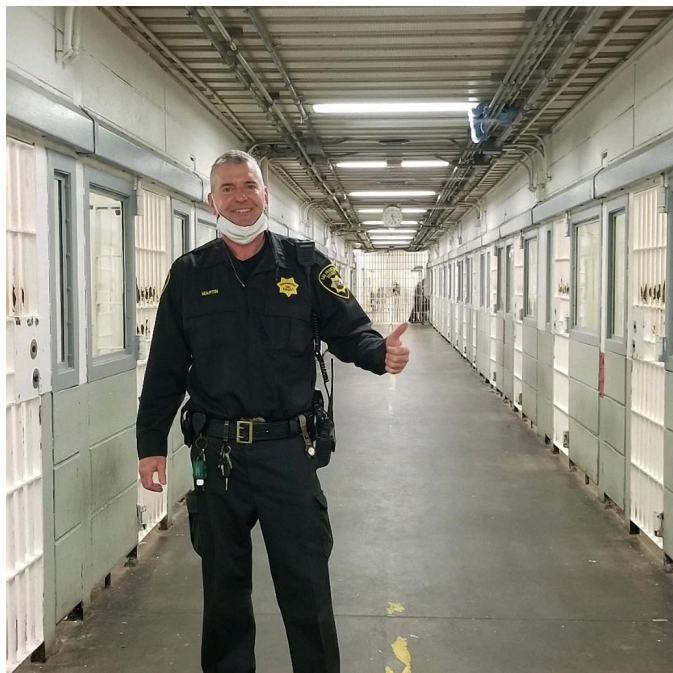
- The IASC is open and wondering when we'll be returning. Included was:
