San Francisco Council Meeting

SFCCLC: We hosted the April 28th meeting of the San Francisco Council. Five of our Lions were present: President Bob & Zenaida Lawhon, Sharon Eberhardt, Steve Martin, and Lyle Workman. Lion Bob handled the pledge, patriotic song, and called on Lion Zenaida Lawhon to deliver the invocation.

Control of the meeting was then returned to Lion Peter Lam. The business portion proceeded per their agenda from reports to remarks by District officers.

Then back to us for the entertainment which was made up of six multiple choice questions about San Francisco. In all, five gift cards were won by those in attendance. 'Till next Council meeting.

Installation of Officers

After a long absence, an official Installation has been planned for Saturday, July 17 at 12 noon. It will be held at the Basque Cultural Center in South San Francisco. Details and pricing are being firmed up and will be relayed when available. We will have to have at least 20 in attendance, so put this on your calendar and be sure to attend. Lion Mario Benavente will be the installing officer. More to follow.

District Constitution & By-law Changes

A full report on the changes can be dowloaded. These changes effect the District documents, but will have very little effect on us. Here is a synopsis:

- Amendment 1 rewrites Article 8, Section 4, and other clauses, to clarify form and function of the Budget and Finance Committee.
- Amendment 2 updates Article 8, Section 10 to clarify the job of the District Governor to appoint a non-Lion accountant to file the District taxes.
- Amendment 3 updates Article 6, Section 3a concerning delegates and alternates, the deadline for their registration, and procedures they are to follow.
- Amendment 4 adds a paragraph to Article 8, Section 6 limiting the two

- coordinating councils to only raising funds for the Police, Firefighters, and Sheriffs awards dinners.
- Amendment 5 makes minor changes to wording in Article 8, Section 6.
- Amendment 6 on By-Laws adds a sentence to Article 1, Section 2 requiring the Nominations Committee to review and report applications within 7 days; it also sets the Cabinet meeting where the Nominations Committee will place the name of candidates, and sets times for speeches.
- Amendment 7 on By-Laws adds info to Article 1, Section 5 to clarify the Election Committee.
- Changes are also made fo the District Policy Manual; download full report to review these.

With schools opening back up, she offered a brief explanation of where our possible donation to the Association would be used. If anyone would like to read the entire text of her letter, please let Lion Lyle Workman know.
